A keen schoolboy footballer, Jack discovered Karting aged 12 at a local indoor circuit and at the age of 13 began competing on the international outdoor Karting scene.

"I passed my racing licence test and competed in my first race at Wombwell circuit, near Barnsley. I finished a credible 9th and won the Novice trophy beating far more experienced and older drivers. My first win came only a few races later when I won the 2004 Junior Rotax Max Gold Cup becoming the youngest driver ever to win the competition. By now I had totally finished with football and was racing most weekends to satisfy my new-found passion."

At the end of the 2004 season Jack signed to race with the HRS Motorsport team in the 2005 British and European Rotax championships and had a successful year despite being one of the youngest drivers on the grid.

In 2006 he joined the Protrain Racing team to compete in the British and European championships. Jack went on to win the European Championship and finish runner up in the World Rotax Finals that year. Jack was also vice champion in the BRDC Stars of Tomorrow Championship (the championship which helped launch the career of Lewis Hamilton).

An exciting 2007 season saw Jack move into the premier gearbox Karting class; 125 ICC, where he claimed 2nd in the British Championships in his debut year.
